Best Practice –I:

Title of the Practice: Extension Activities


Objectives of the Practice: Youth leadership and community development

The Context: - The extension activity is the third dimension of education. Along with academic, social and personal life, the NSS/NCC allows the students to contribute services to the community and the nation. The college through these extension activities provides the students a platform to get involved with real life activities and there by become responsible citizens of India.

The Practice: - Due to outbreak of covid-19, some extension activities were performed in physical presence with limited participants, following the covid norms of social distancing. Some activities were conducted through online mode. These activities focused on creating awareness about covid pandemic and about enhanced importance of physical fitness. College organized extension activities with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community services.

Evidence of Success: - Through these activities, students are motivated and get an opportunity to do social work and develop sense of nationality. Various programs organized by NSS imparts the importance of social service and community work. This helps the volunteers to understand the context of their relationship with the community. The volunteers involved in different activities also acquire leadership qualities leading to national and social harmony.

Problems Encountered and Resources required: - The NSS volunteers are supposed to understand the community around, identify its needs and find solutions for them, acquire skills for mobilizing community participation, acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude and come forward to tackle the situations created by emergencies or natural disasters. Covid 19 posed as a major hindrance while conducting activities for NSS. Large gatherings and outdoor service events could not be arranged due to covid lockdowns, however college tried to maintain the spirit of social and national service by conducting a few programs.























Best Practice II: - Competitive Examination Centre

Objective of the Practice: Enhancing competitive abilities and to motivate students for probable career in Government and Corporate Sector.

The Context: - Job sectors in India include areas of the economy providing various professions and career opportunities; each requiring a set of skills, specialties and qualifications.

The Practice: - College has established a Competitive Examination Cell wherein interested students are enrolled and guidance classes and workshops are conducted to enhance their basic language skill, general aptitude, general knowledge and subject skills like basic mathematics, history, geography, which are required in a broader context to appear for exams like MPSC, Maharashtra Police Department, Railways and other Civil Service examination. Due to outbreak of covid-19 pandemic organization of physical classes was not permitted. However, covid guidelines relaxed during the month of October and November. A batch of 15 students was formed and their classes were conducted twice a week by maintaining social distancing and sanitization rules.

Evidence of Success: - Regular coaching creates awareness about the various career opportunities in the government sector and students appear for different competitive examinations. The activities of the cell also create awareness among students about their community and civilian responsibilities and help learners make proper and realistic occupation choices and professional direction.

Problems Encountered and Resources required: - Covid-19 pandemic proved a great obstacle in achieving the desired goal of this program. Implementation of syllabus-based teaching in online mode created a financial burden on the students resulting in driving their attention away from co-curricular activities. The competitive examination cell tried to conduct online classes but students prioritized the syllabus classes due to limitations of internet access. Regularity of the students is another challenge. Due to constraints of covid students face difficulties to attend the classes regularly.

Best Practices III: Environment Consciousness and Sustainability

- **2. Objectives of the Practice:** To create awareness about nature conservation and sustainable development.
- **3. The Context:** We as an educational institute are committed to protecting our planet and creating awareness among students by conducting various environmentally conscious activities.


